


Problem:
Singular Indefinite Pronouns

each	no
every	nobody
either	anybody
neither	somebody
one	everybody
no one	nothing
anyone	anything
someone	something
▶ everyone	everything

"Everyone," along with the rest of the singular indefinite pronouns, uses a singular verb and singular pronouns, like this:

Yes, "everyone" is **SINGULAR**, and that's a problem! 



Everyone does his homework on time.

Singular verb and pronoun, which creates another problem: correct grammar ("his") is not gender neutral.

Fixed for gender neutrality:

Everyone does their homework on time.

But now the grammar is incorrect: SINGULAR "everyone" and PLURAL "their"!

Fixed, gender neutral, and grammatically correct:

All students do their homework on time.

Fixed, but clunky:

Everyone does his or her homework on time.

A+

Note: It is not as punchy or direct, but it is gender neutral and grammatically correct. "Students," "do," and "their" are all PLURAL.
