### Science-Fiction Settings


Sci-fi setting	Sci-fi setting

Someone is abandoned or left behind.	UFOs/ETs land.

A family travels through space on a mission that must be completed by a certain time or bad things will happen.	Someone creates a creature that runs amok.
Sci-fi situation	Sci-fi situation
A character tries to find out what is causing strange happenings on Earth.	Someone lands on a reportedly empty planet but finds inhabitants.

Strange plant life or beings grant wishes/deep desires.	Someone experiences time travel, a parallel universe, or an alternate universe.

Someone lands on a supposedly inhabited planet but finds it empty.	Someone returns to Earth after a mission—but is it really Earth?
